- Founded in 2003 near Kolkata, with Just 3 Children in a Rented Building
- •At present, serving more than 50,000 plus children in MP & 1900 plus children in Bengal
- Areas: Education, Nutrition, Health
- •Parivaar's Founder is Mr. Vinayak Lohani (Distinguished Alumnus of IIT Kharagpur & IIM Calcutta)
- •National Award for Child Welfare 2011, by the President of India
- •Sanskriti Award 2011 by the President of India

RESIDENTIAL INSTITUTIONS IN WEST BENGAL

- •West Bengal's Largest Free Residential Educational Institution for children from vulnerable and extremely poor backgrounds.
- Parivaar provides Total Support Schooling, Residence, Food, Medical support, Clothes etc.
- Each year, there are about 1500 applications received, and 150 children are admitted based on their need.
- •Although beginning their education quite late, 9 batches of grade 12 students have passed with 100%, while 11 batches of grade 10 students have passed with 97%.
- •More Than 400 of Parivaar Earliest Children Getting Employable After Skill Programs with NSDC Affiliates

1. SEVA KUTIRS: Day-Boarding Supplementary Meals –cum-Education Centers

- •Village community provided venue zero infra costs.
- •More than 50 thousand children served in 680 villages across 15 districts
- Nutritious meals and 5 hours of education in morning & evening shifts
- •Staff is mostly taken from the Local tribal (indigenous) community
- •Community involvement in seva Kutirs through Various activities health & village welfare & development



NEED OF SEVA KUTIRS

- •The state / province of Madhya Pradesh is 4th worst in wasting, 3rd worst in stunting.
- •Highest Anemia among Tribal, main reason poor diet: 32 % thin adolescents against National average of 24 %
- •Only 41% of Grade V students in rural MP can read a Grade II level text. In remote tribal villages, this number is even less.
- •Only 20% of Grade V students can do "division". In remote tribal areas where we have Seva Kutirs, this goes down to 10%.
- •Children as young as 5 to 6-year-old (both girls and boys) are addicted to tobacco.



SEVA KUTIRS: OBJECTIVES

Nutritional objectives

- 1.Elimination of chronic hunger by provision of meals
- 2.General betterment in health & lower incidence of sickness
- 3.Improvement in hygiene, de-addiction.

Educational objectives

- 1.Improvement in foundational learning.
- 2.All children completing at least 12 years of education without any dropouts.

Community development:

1. Supporting access to medical facilities for treatment and making government programme and benefits more accessible.

EDUCATION AND NUTRITION IN SEVA KUTIR

- Categorisation of Students based on learning levels
 - **–PRE-PRIMARY**: Age group: 3-6 Grades:1-2
 - **-PRIMARY:** Age group: 7-10 Years Grades: 2-5
 - **-UPPER PRIMARY**: Age group: 11-14 Years: Grades: 6-8
- •50,000 Children Get 2 Meals Daily: Morning Breakfast (With Milk & Fruits) & Evening Dinner (Roti, Sabji, Pulses and Rice). A Uniform Menu is Followed Across All Kutirs
- •Languages, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Co-Curricular activities, Games and Sports.
- Tests conducted twice in a month designed by Education Resource Persons
- •Engagement in Village awareness activities on days like Independence Day, Gandhi Jayanti, World Yoga Day etc.
- •Provision of Educational Resources like Pratham Mini-libraries, Amar Chitra Katha's etc.
- Regular Trainings of Teachers by Education Resource Persons


2. 24*7 AMBULANCE SERVICES

- •More than 100 Ambulances operating 24*7 in Extremeley Remote & Poor Tribal Areas in 25 Districts of Madhya Pradesh.
- Cater to 2-3 patients daily and run 100-150 kms.
- •These have served more than 1.70 lakh cases in the last 22 months.
- Emergency transportation to nearest govt. hospitals
- •Information about this is circulated among the Panchayat officials, village health workers etc.
- •2 drivers and 2 attendants on each ambulance for day and night shift









3. MOBILE HEALTH CLINICS

- •Running 14 Mobile Clinics in 9 Districts
- A Qualified Doctor Visits 2-3 villages daily & treats patients
- Daily 100-150 cases are treated & medicines provided
- More than 7lakh persons served in last 21 months.
- More than 600 villages served.
- •Patients who require more advanced care are sent to advanced facilities in Delhi, Bhopal, Indore, Nagpur etc.








4. VISION RESTORATION PROGRAM

- •Thousands of Persons, esp. Elderly, Suffer from Cataract & Other Eye Ailments
- •We Collaborated with Some Highly Reputed & Big Eye Hospitals in the Region
- •Patients are examined, given medication, and glasses during eye camps.
- Those in Need of Surgery are Taken to the Hospital by Parivaar
